Avista Corporation d/b/a Avista Utilities (Avista) respectfully submits this Supplemental Data pursuant to “Administrative Law Judge’s Ruling attaching Data Requests to Small and Multi-Jurisdictional Utilities” dated December 22, 2004.

INTRODUCTION

Avista Utilities serves approximately 18,600 customers in and around the resort community of South Lake Tahoe. Additionally, Avista Utilities provides retail natural gas service to approximately 298,000 customers in Washington, Idaho and Oregon and retail electric service to approximately 325,000 customers in Washington and Idaho. The South Lake Tahoe natural gas distribution facilities were purchased from CP National Corporation in 1991.

Hi Sherrene,

SBX was primarily spent on retro windows, furnace replacements and water heater replacements. Avista's understanding is that we can't do furnaces unless it's a safety related issue. Windows are also no longer an approved measure as are floors and attics with an existing R19. We are only doing the measures approved by the CPUC.

Regarding the question on outreach for CARE, we are not forgoing any outreach. Avista had decided that our best "bang for the buck" is direct mail and we will do at least three mailings this year. We may participate in some co-op opportunities but for the most part it's the direct mail which should give us good results for less cost allowing us to move dollars to cover the increased cost of tracking and reporting program results.

The \$10,000 shift will be for additional staff responsibility for reporting these programs and has nothing to do with the Avista's accounting system. The new accounting system is scheduled to be implemented in January, 2005 and will replace Avista's 18 year old system.
