# History



### Background:

- SB 535 (2012): Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund partially earmarked for projects within and benefitting "Disadvantaged Communities" (DACs)
  - CalEPA's CalEnviroScreen defines DACs
- AB 32 (2002), SB 350 (2015), and others
  - SCE estimates 47% of all DACs in CA are within SCE service territory

#### June 2017:

 Southern California Edison invited The Greenlining Institute to co-facilitate and co-convene a working group, now called the Clean Energy Access Working Group





# Purpose



## Clean Energy Access Working Group (CEAWG):

- Diverse, cross-sector, multi-issue-area body that meets bimonthly
- Space to discuss, propose, and workshop clean energy ideas, programs, and projects within DACs
- Forum for long-term collaboration, skillful facilitation, strategic community engagement, and cross-sector relationships

### Purpose:

- Convene key stakeholders to discuss, design, and review policies, programs, and projects specifically targeting DACs from an equity framework
- Design, plan, and implement demonstration projects or programs to model the necessity of community-led approaches for clean energy in DACs

# Focus Group -> Working Group



- June 2017 December 2017:
  - Space to talk, present, offer ideas and presentations (focus group)
    - Topics: transportation electrification, electric vehicle incentive programs, marketing, outreach, and engagement challenges and strategies
- January 2018:
  - Venue for change and opportunity for cross-sector planning, engagement,
     and implementation of a specific demonstration project (working group)
    - Topic: community-owned community solar project
    - Related topics: rate design, EV charging, financing, program design



## **Best Practices**



- Recognize and value different types of expertise
  - o Community voices & lived experience just as valuable as technical expertise
- Welcome questions
  - New process, new players working together all learners here
- Minimize technical speak, where possible
  - Keep barrier to entry in conversation low
  - And/or explain the technical speak, offer entry points for non-technical folks
- Stay solutions-oriented
  - Navigate differences of opinion diplomatically and respectfully
  - Identify both challenges and possible paths forward





## Learnings



- How to set a diverse table
  - Logistics of how to accommodate needs, perspectives, learning edges of diverse body of stakeholders
- How to lead while learning
  - New process, players, and learnings all around especially for GLI & SCE
- Cross-sector engagement is challenging and necessary
  - Encourage more spaces and venues like this
