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Introduction

Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby submits its Low Income Assistance Programs Monthly Report for November 2008. This monthly report includes a brief narrative and quantitative tables (attached hereto), which describe the results of program activity during the month of November 2008 for SCE's low income assistance programs – the Low Income Energy Efficiency (LIEE) program, the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) program and the Cool Center program.

In D.06-12-038, the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) approved the format of the accompanying tables, which were developed by consensus among the joint utilities (SCE, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) and San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E)), the Energy Division, and the Division of Ratepayer Advocates. The tables in this report conform to the monthly reporting tables that were attached to the email from the Energy Division on November 28, 2007.

All results reported in this monthly report update and supersede data provided in previous reports.

California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) Program

As of November 30, 2008, a total of 1,100,928 customers were participating in the CARE program. Based on SCE's estimates of CARE-eligible customers and the income eligibility of 200% of federal poverty guidelines, SCE's current enrollment equates to a penetration rate of approximately 82%.

Outreach efforts and communications to SCE's in-language customers and under-penetrated areas continue to be a priority. SCE partners with the Equal Opportunity and Public Affairs Departments in CARE outreach activities that target SCE's hard-to-reach customer base. SCE has participated in many customer events through its Public Affairs department, wherein thousands of CARE applications are distributed to low-income customer populations throughout SCE's service territory.

In the month of November, SCE implemented a CARE/FERA awareness campaign in SCE's service territory. The Hemet Valley Health Fair was held in conjunction with PrimeCare of Hemet Valley, and its main focus was low income and fixed income seniors. The fair gathered roughly 300 attendees. The CARE Marketing analyst attended the event and staffed the SCE CARE booth, providing information on the CARE and FERA Programs to event attendees. Hundreds of CARE applications, informational flyers and promotional items were disseminated. In-language CARE applications, flyers and event posters were also provided.

In addition, continued focus was placed on using existing CARE Capitation agencies to provide one-on-one assistance to SCE's hardest-to-reach customer base. SCE's CARE Program has experienced a significant increase in CARE enrollments through its

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Capitation agencies. SCE's CARE Program has also experienced a significant increase in the number and participation of Capitation agencies.

SCE continues to include a CARE enrollment application in the Welcome Kit that is sent to residents requesting new service or transfers of service. In 2008, as of November 30, 22,343 customers were enrolled in CARE as a result of this Welcome Kit.

In October 2007, SCE sent out approximately 50,000 bilingual direct mailers, which included a CARE enrollment application, to targeted customers not on the CARE rate. Through November 30, 2008, SCE received 2,407 enrollment applications resulting in 1,493 new enrollments and 541 recertifications.

In December 2007, SCE sent out approximately 193,000 bilingual direct mailers, which included a CARE enrollment application, targeting customers who have received a Final Call notice. Through November 30, 2008, SCE received 6,593 enrollment applications resulting in 5,271 new enrollments and 650 recertifications.

In January 2008, SCE sent out approximately 280,000 bilingual direct mailers, which included a CARE enrollment application, to targeted customers not on the CARE rate. Through November 30, 2008, SCE received 9,451 enrollment applications resulting in 6,808 new enrollments and 1,088 recertifications.

In February 2008, SCE sent out approximately 87,000 direct mail letters to customers who dropped off the CARE rate between December 31, 2006 and December 31, 2007 due to failure to respond to recertification requests. As of November 30, 2008, SCE received 13,316 enrollment applications resulting in 8,304 new enrollments and 3,036 recertifications.

Additionally, in June 2008, SCE included the CARE enrollment applications in non-CARE customers' bills as part of the annual CARE solicitation. As of November 30, 2008, 29,713 applications have been received, resulting in 22,789 new enrollments and 3,349 recertifications.

In July 2008, SCE sent out approximately 85,000 direct mail letters to customers who dropped from the CARE rate between May 31, 2007 and May 31, 2008 as a result of non-response to recertification requests. As of November 30, 2008, 10,539 applications have been received, resulting in 7,058 new enrollments and 1,586 recertifications.

In July 2008, SCE also sent out approximately 280,000 bilingual direct mailers to targeted customers not on the CARE rate. As of November 30, 2008, 9,778 applications have been received, resulting in 6,910 new enrollments and 1,167 recertifications.

In September 2008, SCE sent out approximately 280,000 bilingual direct mailers to targeted customers not on the CARE rate. As of November 30, 2008, 8,263 applications have been received, resulting in 5,643 enrollments and 1,175 recertifications.

Finally, SCE, as well as PG&E, SDG&E and SoCalGas, are working with the Energy Division to assist the Commission in its efforts to comply with SB 580. Through this SB

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580 pilot program, the joint utilities will facilitate the enrollment of Women, Infants and Children (WIC) participants onto the CARE rate.

Finally, in compliance with D.08-11-031, Ordering Paragraph 90, SCE would like to report that in the month of November, four recertification complaints were received. These complaints were initiated by customers requesting retro-billing of the CARE discount.

Low Income Energy Efficiency (LIEE) Program

SCE continues to strengthen delivery of comprehensive services to its low income customers. SCE contracts directly with an experienced and informed network of providers, including Community Based Organizations (CBOs) and private contractors. SCE also continues to implement LIEE as a leveraging vehicle with CBOs who deliver similar services through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) administered by the California State Department of Community Services. For instance, SCE provides LIHEAP agencies with refrigerators, at no cost, for installation into a joint LIEE/LIHEAP home. This leveraging approach maximizes the budgets of both the LIEE and LIHEAP programs in order to effectively serve as many customers as possible.

SCE also continues to competitively bid the purchase of energy-efficient appliances. By purchasing appliances in bulk, SCE is able to obtain low prices on equipment and exercise a level of control over inventory that may not otherwise be possible.

In Table 1L, SCE reports a fund shift, as authorized in D.08-11-031, in November 2008 of \$4.5 million from the 2009-2011 program cycle that is being carried back to enable sufficient funding to meet program demand through year-end 2008, and to ensure that sufficient appliances are on hand to support the 2009 program activity beginning in January 2009.

Conclusion

SCE appreciates this opportunity to provide the Commission with updated information about the successes SCE has achieved in its LIEE and CARE programs.

The \$4.5 million is less than 15% of the currently authorized program cycle budget. The entire \$4.5 million has been added to the "Electric Appliances" budget subcategory. The prior amount in this category, reflecting prior authorized and carryover funding, was \$26,642,414. If some of this funding remains unspent through 2008, it will be carried forward to the "Electric Appliances subcategory in the 2009 - 2011 program cycle.
