**Southern California Edison Company's (U 338-E) Low Income Assistance Programs Monthly Report
September 2007**

Introduction

Southern California Edison Company (SCE) hereby submits its Low Income Assistance Programs Monthly Report for September 2007.¹ This monthly report includes a brief narrative and quantitative tables (attached hereto), which describe the results of program activity during the month of September 2007 for SCE's low income assistance programs – the Low Income Energy Efficiency (LIEE) program, the California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) program and the Cool Center program.

In D.06-12-038, the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) approved the format of the accompanying tables, which were developed by consensus among the joint utilities (SCE, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) and San Diego Gas & Electric Company (SDG&E)), the Energy Division, and the Division of Ratepayer Advocates.

Minor changes have been made to the tables to incorporate input received at the February 21, 2007 workshop on low income reporting conducted by the Energy Division. Additionally, the joint utilities and the Energy Division held a conference call on April 27, 2007 to discuss additional information that the Energy Division requested during the February 21 workshop. The joint utilities are now reporting this information in tables 5L and 6C.

All results reported in this monthly report update and supersede data provided in previous reports.

California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) Program

As of September 30, 2007, a total of 1,040,299 customers were participating in the CARE program. Based on SCE's estimates of CARE-eligible customers and the income eligibility of 200% of federal poverty guidelines, SCE's current enrollment equates to a penetration rate of approximately 76%.

Outreach efforts and communications to SCE's in-language customers and under-penetrated areas continue to be a priority. SCE partners with the Equal Opportunity and Public Affairs Departments in CARE outreach activities that target SCE's hard-to-reach customer base. For the month of September, SCE participated in several outreach events in partnership with SCE's Public Affairs and Residential Energy Efficiency Departments. One such event was the LA County Energy Fair held on September 27, 2007. This was the first event of its kind, and CARE information and applications were disseminated to hundreds of attendees. Multilingual volunteers were on hand to assist low income customers in their language of preference.

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SCE continues to include a CARE enrollment application in the Welcome Kit that is sent to residents requesting new service or transfers of service. In 2007, as of September 30, 2007, 18,165 customers were enrolled in CARE as a result of this Welcome Kit.

Additionally, in June 2007, SCE included the CARE enrollment application in non-CARE customers' bills as part of the annual CARE solicitation. As a result of this effort, 26,781 applications have been received resulting in 21,752 new enrollments and 2,415 recertifications.

In July 2007, SCE sent out approximately 86,000 direct mail letters to customers who dropped off of the CARE rate between April 2006 and May 2007 due to failure to respond to recertification requests. Through September 30, 2007, SCE has received 11,229 enrollment applications resulting in 8,017 new enrollments and 1,364 recertifications.

In early-August, SCE developed and sent approximately 280,000 bilingual direct mail letters, which included a CARE enrollment application, to targeted customers currently not on the CARE rate. Through September 30, 2007, SCE has received 11,220 enrollment applications resulting in 7,514 new enrollments and 2,639 recertifications.

Finally, SCE, as well as PG&E, SDG&E, and SoCalGas, are working with the Energy Division to assist the Commission in its efforts to comply with SB 580. Through this SB 580 pilot program, the joint utilities will facilitate the enrollment of Women, Infants, Children (WIC) participants onto the CARE rate.

Low Income Energy Efficiency (LIEE) Program

SCE continues to strengthen delivery of comprehensive services to its low income customers. SCE contracts directly with an experienced and informed network of providers, including Community Based Organizations (CBOs) and private contractors. SCE also continues to implement LIEE as a leveraging vehicle with CBOs who deliver similar services through the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) administered by the California State Department of Community Services. For instance, SCE provides LIHEAP agencies with refrigerators, at no cost, for installation into a joint LIEE/LIHEAP home. This leveraging approach maximizes the budgets of both the LIEE and LIHEAP programs in order effectively to serve as many customers as possible.

SCE also continues to competitively bid the purchase of energy-efficient appliances. By purchasing appliances in bulk, SCE is able to obtain low prices on equipment and exercise a level of control over inventory that may not otherwise be possible.

Cool Centers

SCE's Cool Centers provide low-income, senior and disabled residents a cool, safe place to gather during hot summer months. Cool Centers are located in isolated communities

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in extreme climate areas, where few public facilities are available for use to offer relief from the heat. Cool Centers also provide a place where customers can learn more about SCE's low income and energy efficiency programs, energy conservation and other available community programs.

Currently, SCE has Cool Center locations in Blythe, Hesperia, Highgrove, Highland, Joshua Tree, Landers, Palm Desert, Perris, Redlands, Rubidoux, San Jacinto and Yucaipa.

Conclusion

SCE appreciates this opportunity to provide the Commission with updated information about the successes SCE has achieved in its LIEE, CARE and Cool Center programs.
