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I. INTRODUCTION

In Ordering Paragraphs (OP) 14 through 17 of Decision (D.) 01-05-033 the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) directs Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas) and the other Investor Owned Utilities (IOUs)¹ to provide monthly status reports on the costs and impacts of their Rapid Deployment (RD) efforts on their California Alternate Rates for Energy (CARE) and Low Income Energy Efficiency (LIEE) programs.

In Application (A.) 06-06-033 SoCalGas proposed changes to the monthly Rapid Deployment reports in an effort to streamline the reports while maintaining their value. SoCalGas, along with the other utilities, then worked closely with the Energy Division to further develop and update the tables used to report low-income program activity on a monthly basis. In D.06-12-038, the utilities' proposed changes for the monthly program reporting were approved. The reports will henceforth be referred to as the "Monthly Reports on Low Income Assistance Programs."

¹ The other IOUs include San Diego Gas & Electric Company, Southern California Edison Company, and Pacific Gas and Electric Company.

This fifth monthly report on SoCalGas' 2008 Low Income Assistance Programs includes actual LIEE and CARE results and expenditures through May.

II. OUTREACH and LEVERAGING for CARE AND LIEE

During March and April, SoCalGas issued a bill insert and conducted three e-mail enrollment campaigns which resulted in the addition of over 15,500 and 5,000 respective new enrollments onto the CARE rate discount. Both of these outreach campaigns were supported by a multi-lingual CARE mass media campaign that covered the majority of SoCalGas' service area.

III. LOW-INCOME ENERGY EFFICIENCY (LIEE)

May Results – LIEE Installations

SoCalGas processed and paid for the installation of weatherization measures in 4,702 homes for the month of May.

The total number of appliances serviced during May was 626, which included 415 furnace repairs, 195 furnace replacements, and 16 water heater replacements.

LIEE measure and appliance installations processed and paid during the month can be found in SoCalGas' Table 2L, LIEE Measure Installations & Savings.

LIEE Authorized Funding Versus Actual Expenditures

SoCalGas' LIEE Program expenditures totaled \$2.4 million for services processed and paid during the month of May, and \$6.8 million year-to-date. An additional \$477 thousand was spent on administration, for a year-to-date program administration cost of \$1.8 million. Total costs year-to-date are 26% of the 2008 authorized budget (See Table 1L).

IV. CALIFORNIA ALTERNATE RATES FOR ENERGY (CARE)

May CARE Enrollment Results

As of May 2008, 1,372,615 residential customers were enrolled in the CARE program, which is a net increase of 15,250 customers from April 2008. During May, 34,256 new CARE applications were approved, which included 87 from CARE capitation contractors and 10,092 through SoCalGas' inter-utility agreements (See Table 2C). SoCalGas' penetration rate for the CARE program at the end of May was 80.4%.

Telephone Enrollments

In May, SoCalGas launched its 3rd Automated Voice Messaging (AVM) campaign for CARE. This campaign targets low-income customers throughout the SoCalGas service territory who were recently dropped from CARE due to non-response to the program's recertification requirement. The May AVM campaign produced over 2,500 new enrollments at an estimated cost of just over \$2.00 each. Year-to-date, SoCalGas' strategic use of AVM has enrolled over 13,500 customers into CARE.

Third-Party Enrollments

During May, SoCalGas' CARE Third Party door-to-door outreach program produced 6,141 new enrollments. This program targets SoCalGas' hardest-to-reach low-income customers who have been non-responsive to most other outreach methods. Year-to-date, over 27,000 new customers have enrolled in CARE through SoCalGas' third-party enrollment process.

CARE Authorized Funding Versus Actual Expenditures

During May, CARE administrative expenses totaled \$683,000. Year-to-date costs totaled \$2.1 million which is 44% of the authorized 2008 CARE administrative budget. CARE rate and Service Establishment Charge discounts for May totaled \$13.3 million. Year-to-date costs are \$61.7 million which is 49% of the projected 2008 CARE Subsidies and Benefits budget.

The comparison of actual expenses to the budgeted figures for May is provided in Table 1C.

CONCLUSION

SoCalGas continues to implement its outreach efforts with the goal of providing LIEE services to as many qualified customers as possible and increasing CARE participation during PY2008.
