

 - Liberty Hill: Centralized Administrator and Technical Assistance




Strategy #1: Reach Most Impacted Communities

Focus on More Isolated "Frontline" Communities

- 84% of all households in DACs
- 62% of DACs in top 10% of CalEnviroScreen 3.0






Strategy #2: Integrated Program Outreach



Bill Savings Financial aid and utility bill discounts for income- and medical-eligible households PROGRAMS INCLUDE: CARE/FERA, Medical Baseline, Lifeline, LIHEAP, Energy and Gas Assistance Funds



Home Efficiency Whole house efficiency upgrades, appliance rebates, and giveaways PROGRAMS INCLUDE: LIHEAP, ESA, HEIP, AC Optimization, turf removal, free shade trees, SMART thermostats



Free Solar Free solar panel installations for income eligible households
PROGRAMS INCLUDE: Single Family Solar Affordable Homes (SASH), Low-Income Weatherization Program (LIWP)



Home Repair Up to \$15,000 for health and safety-related repairs thru City and County programs PROGRAMS INCLUDE: Single Family Home Improvement Program, Handyworker Program



Clean Vehicles Up to \$18,500 for new or used electric and plug-in hybrid vehicles PROGRAMS INCLUDE: Replace Your Ride, CVRP, CVAP, utility EV rebates and charger incentives





Alternative and Shared Mobility Transit vouchers, car and bikeshares

PROGRAMS INCLUDE: Replace Your Ride, BlueLA, Metro Bike Share

Pacoima Beautiful Impact on Organization

- Three years with EmPOWER but many more with Liberty Hill
- 284 individual families have applied for Empower
- Replace Your Ride and the refrigerator program have also been a great help to our members



Pacoima Beautiful Impact on Community

- The addition of the smog repair program has peaked the interest of new and old members
- To date, following social distancing protocol, we have had six in person workshops to aid in filling out applications
- Social media (FB, IG, Twitter) has assisted us in reaching more people and due to the influx of interest we are expanding to new areas



Our Work & Impact

- Conversations and skill building sessions, focused on relevant issues responding to community concerns
 - Ex: Urban farming, zoom for beginners
- During the pandemic, emPOWER became synonymous with resources and support.
- LRT aims to empower our community and share resources, especially during a time that caused stress and uncertainty.





Goals & Lessons Learned

- Continue to create programming and opportunities for us to learn with the community
- Continue expanding to the Inland Empire
- Promote conversation and facilitate conversions geared towards solutions to some of the common challenges that we face in this region.







"Redeemer Community Partnership was created in 1992, and we have been serving South LA for almost 30 years. Policy focus is education, environmental and social justice, active transportation infrastructure, and community sustainability. Our mission is to create a safe, healthy, opportunity-rich community where children and their families thrive. The population in the neighborhoods we serve is culturally diverse, but it has strong ties and commitment to work together to improve our community."

- Working in partnership with Liberty Hill/emPOWER for 2 years
- Pilot through the online FB campaign; other outreach methods include organic flyer distribution in corner bodegas, neighborhood schools, and churches.
 - More than 1000 intake forms;
 - 200 people referred to clean vehicle programs; 35+ approved for grants; more
 - 350 people referred to CAP,
 - Approximately 100 people retired vehicles or received smog repair support
 - many more received ratepayer subsidies with Edison, LADWP and Gas
 Company



- Since partnering with Liberty Hill, RCP hired a coordinator dedicated only to emPOWER and currently considering an additional intake hire for the large sums of incoming calls.
- Reached approximately 200 people in 2 weeks after our first social media pilot, and another 200 people in 3 weeks after an ABC news piece.
- Working with emPOWER has been an amazing tool to help our community, learn as an organization, create a rapport with new members of our community, and to strengthen our relationships with old members.



- emPOWER as an opportunity to help families during Covid-19, with referrals from private organizations, hospitals, or social workers from the Department of Public Social Services in the LA County, but most impactful referrals come from word of mouth and networks of trust
- Increasing interest on EV programs but there are not enough programs to satisfy the interest. Another program that has been successful is CAP, to retire and to repair
- It has been a great opportunity to meet new people and to be able to walk together looking for solutions and creating community.
