SDG&E has Unique Challenges and Opportunities



Limited energy savings

- Moderate climate and limited industrial customers result in lower savings potential
- Regional programs have a history of being non-cost-effective
- SDG&E's programs have minimal impact on California's clean-energy goals
- Smallest IOU geographically; only accounts for ~7% of state's electric load forecast



SDREN & SDCP offer programs in same areas

- Most of SDG&E's customers served by San Diego Community Power (SDCP)
- San Diego Regional Energy Network (SDREN) will serve 92% of SDG&E's service territory with EE programming
- SDREN + statewide programs provide EE programs with minimal gaps
